- 1. **WELCOME:** Chairman Montzka called the regular meeting of the East Central Regional Development Commission to order at 7:00 p.m. The Pledge of Allegiance was recited.
- 2. AGENDA APPROVAL: Hansen moved to approve the agenda as presented. Hoefert seconded motion carried.
- 3. MINUTES APPROVAL: Hansen moved to approve the minutes of the December 17, 2018 ECRDC board meeting. Reynolds seconded motion carried.
- 4. **EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR'S REPORT**: Executive Director Voss provided a written report and highlighted several items including:
  - a. <u>CHISAGO COUNTY PUBLIC INTEREST REPRESENTATIVE</u>: One application was received by Tom Lawlor of Chisago City for the Public Interest Representative vacancy. A recommendation was made to the Commission to appoint Tom Lawlor as the Chisago County Public Interest Representative. Motioned by Stenson to approve Tom Lawlor as recommended. Moe seconded motion carried.
  - b. <u>MILLE LACS COUNTY PUBLIC INTEREST REPRESENTATIVE</u>: One application was received by incumbent Linda Evans. A recommendation was made to the Commission to reappoint Linda Evans as the Mille Lacs County Public Interest Representative. Motioned by Reynolds to approve Linda Evans as recommended. Hoefert seconded motion carried.
  - c. <u>CHISAGO COUNTY PERSONNEL & BUDGET (P&B) REPRESENTATIVE:</u> Motioned by Hoefert to appoint Kevin Stenson as the Chisago County representative to the P&B. Evans seconded motion carried.
  - d. <u>AUDIT ENGAGEMENT LETTER</u>: Motioned by Ellis to sign the audit agreement letter for CliftonLarsonAllen LLP to audit the financial statements for FY2019. The estimated cost will be \$10,100. This is the third year of the three-year audit agreement. Seconded by Stenson – motion carried.

- e. <u>AGENDA AMENDMENT:</u> Hansen moved to amend the agenda to include a resolution authorizing submission of grant application to MnDOT for conducting the implementation phase for the Regional Transportation Coordinating Council. Kester seconded motion carried.
- f. <u>REGIONAL TRANSPORTATION COORDINATING COUNCIL RESOLUTION:</u> Motioned by Hoefert authorizing submission of grant application to MnDOT for conducting the implementation phase for the Regional Transportation Coordinating Council. Seconded by Moe motion carried.
- 6. TREASURERS REPORT: The Board reviewed the December 2018 through January 2019 Treasurer's report as presented by Commissioner Ellis. Gullixson moved to approve the Treasurer's Report to include the checks written #10184 through #10231 along with ACH payments from December 1, 2018 through January 30, 2019. Hansen seconded motion carried. General Journals were reviewed and approved for the period December 1, 2018 through January 30, 2019.
- 7. TRANSPORTATION: Simonsen reported on the following items:
  - a. <u>LAKE MILLE LACS SCENIC BYWAYS (LMSB) CORRIDOR MANAGEMENT STUDY:</u> The ECRDC has been asked to take the lead in completing a corridor management plan for the LMSB beginning July 1, 2019 with approximately \$75,000 available for the project. This will develop a community-based Corridor Management Plan for the LMSB. This will outline goals, strategies, and responsibilities for preserving and promoting the newly designated 68-mile scenic byway. Motioned by Evans to approve moving forward with the corridor management plan. Seconded by Bollenbeck motion carried.
  - b. <u>TECHNICAL ASSISTANCE (TA) APPLICATIONS:</u> Applications were received from Pine City in District 1, along with Taylors Falls, and Lindstrom in the MnDOT Metro District. The next TAC meeting is scheduled from April 18<sup>th</sup>.
- 8. EAST CENTRAL REGIONAL TRANSPORTATION COORDINATING COUNCIL (ECRTCC): Onan reported on recent meetings that were held.
  - a. <u>TRANSPORTATION PUBLIC MEETINGS:</u> Three of the four required public meetings have been held sparking conversation. From the meetings the following objectives have been addressed:
    - Office of Mobility Management
    - Viable Volunteer Driver Program
    - Vehicle Sharing
    - Intermodal Transportation Center Hubs
    - Need for more Bus Drivers
  - b. <u>PHASE 2 IMPLEMENTATION OF ECRTCC</u>: Staff will be working on the Phase 2 Implementation application over the next few weeks. Application for this project is due April 12, 2019.
- 9. ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT: Zeller brought forth the following recommendations:
  - a. <u>COMPREHENSIVE ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT STRATEGY (CEDS) BOARD VACANCIES:</u> There are two vacancies on the CEDS Advisory Board. Motioned by Hoefert to appoint Genny Reynolds, Mille Lacs County Private Sector, to the CEDS Advisory Board. Dunkley seconded motion carried. The other vacancy is for a Chamber of Commerce Executive Director. At this time there was no applications for this position. Advertising, phone calls, and social media will be done to fill this position.
  - b. <u>INVENTORS & ENTREPRENEURS CLUB</u>: The ECRDC is partnered with East Central Energy & GPS 45:93 to hold an event on October 31<sup>st</sup> focused on supporting local entrepreneurs and inventors encouraging them to start and grown their business here in the region.
- 10. **TOPICS OF REGIONAL INTEREST:** The City of Lindstrom has been approved for \$3.3 million in increment financing for the development for proposed 92 apartments, marina and restaurant complex, on Hwy. 8 at the east edge of South Lindstrom Lake.

11. **ADJOURNMENT:** Chairman Montzka announced the next meeting will be on April 22, 2019 at the ECRDC offices. Evans moved to adjourn the regular meeting of the ECRDC. Hansen seconded – motion carried.
