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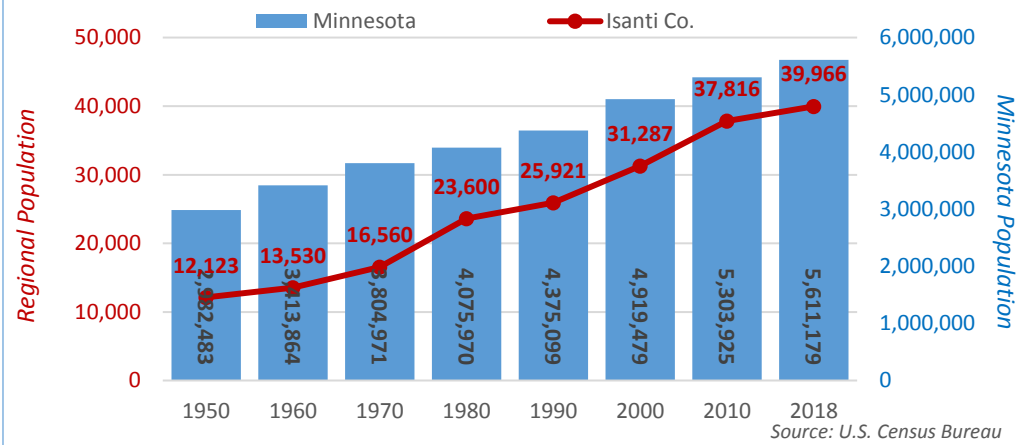

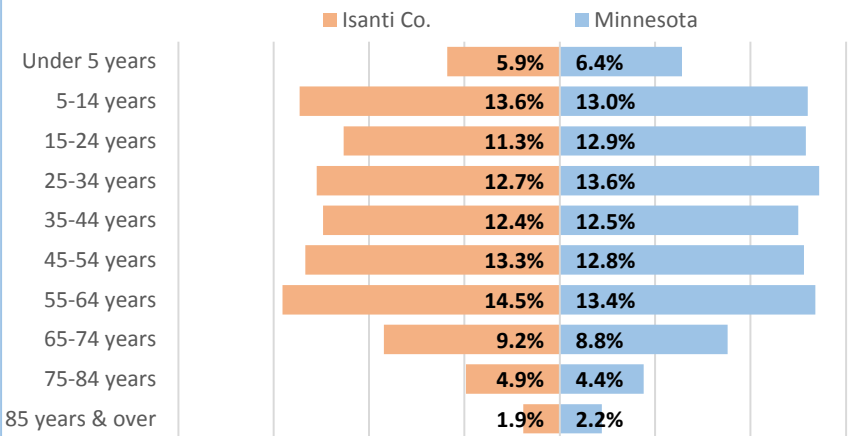

Figure 2. Percentage of Population by Age Group, 2018

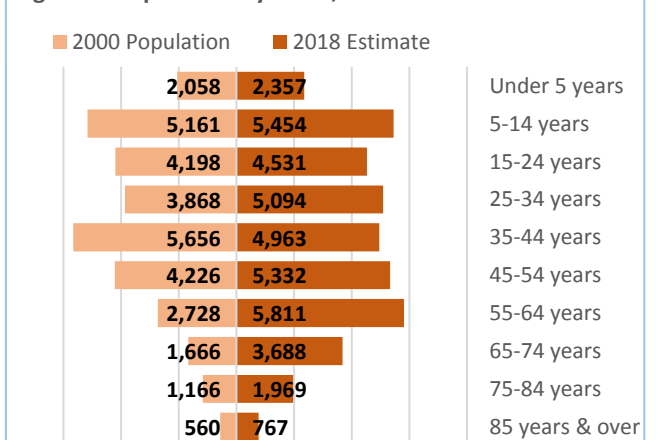

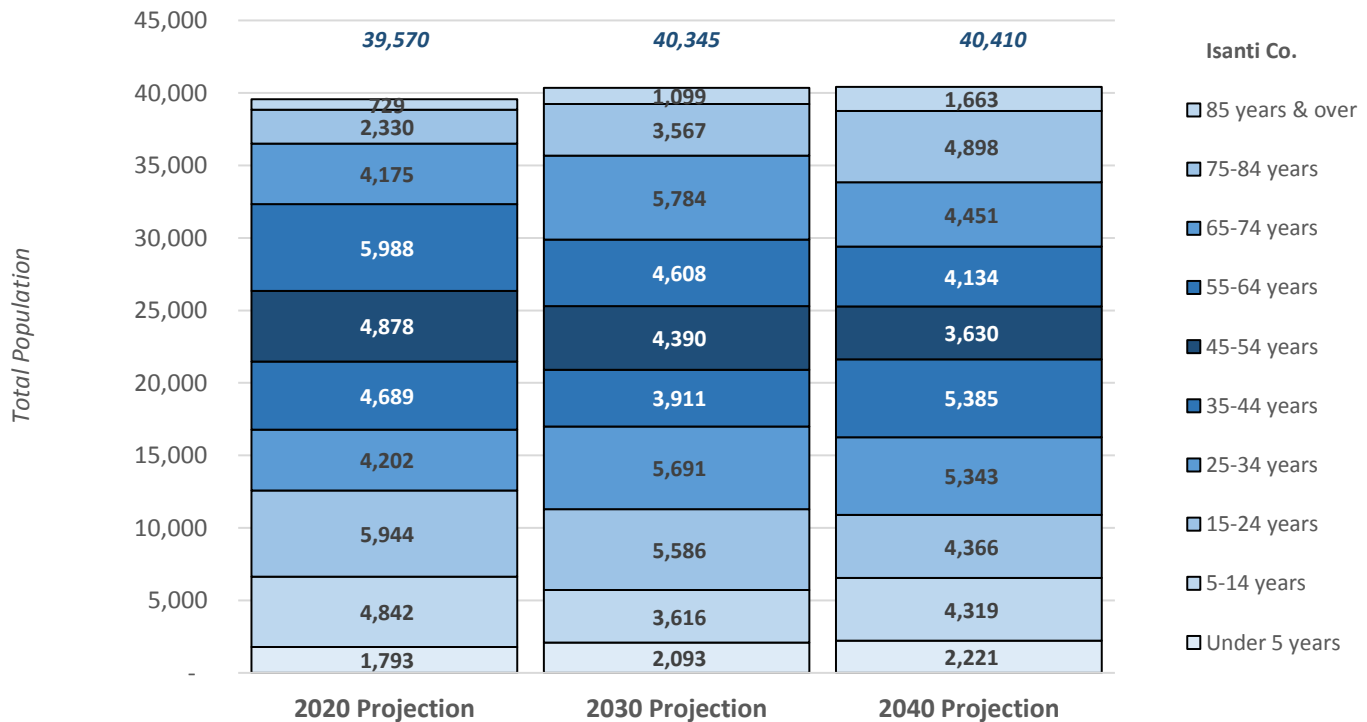

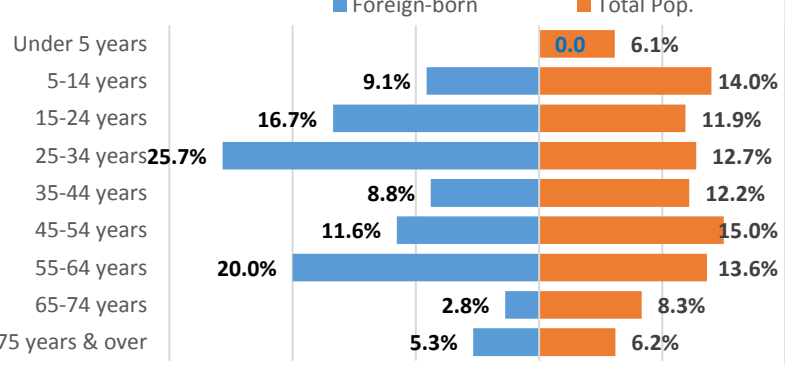

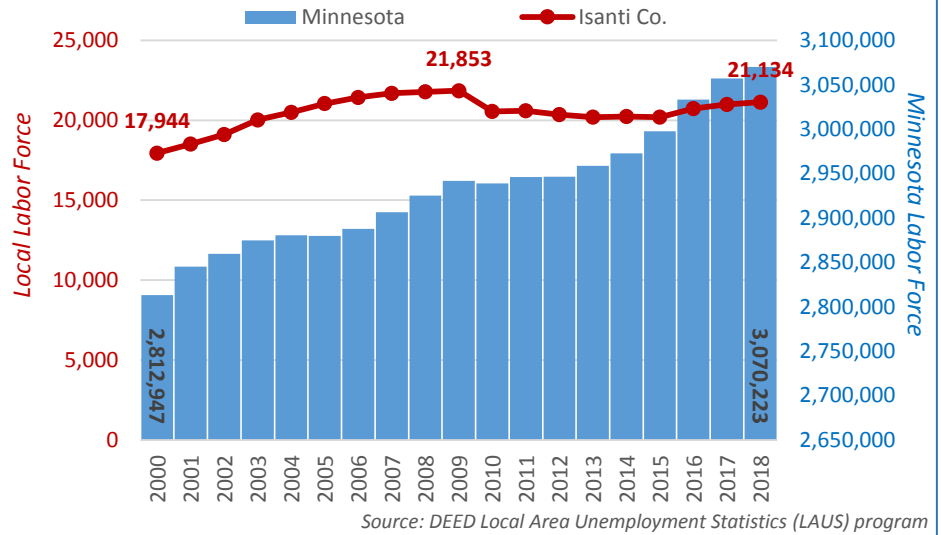

**Figure 6. Annual Labor Force Estimates, 2000-2018**

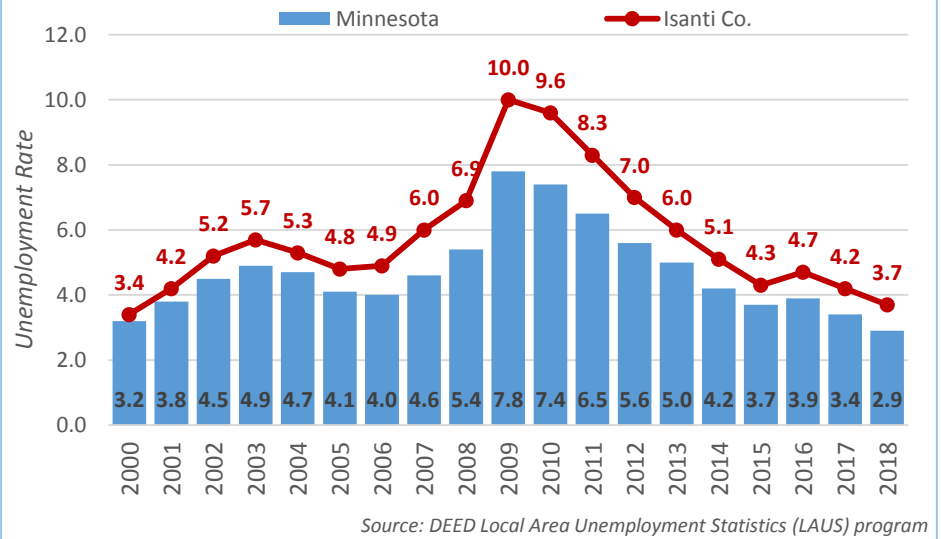

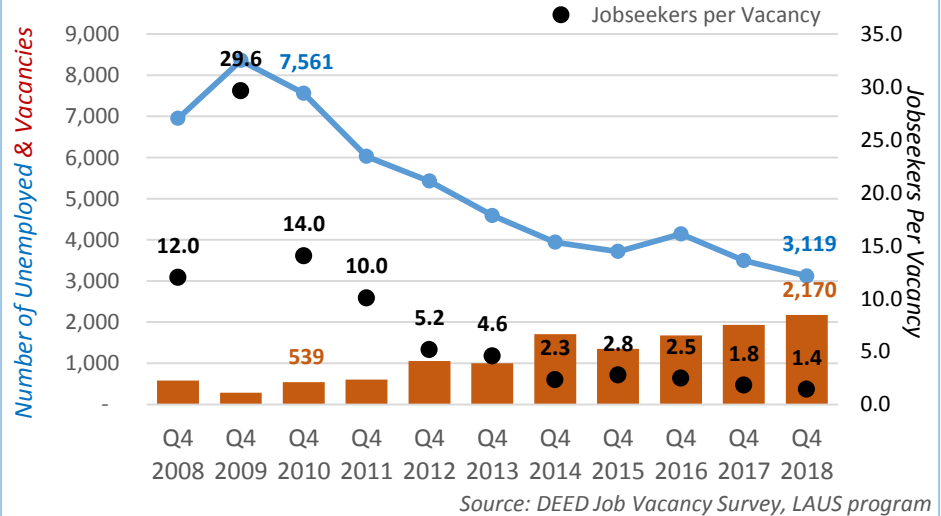

**Figure 9. Annual Change in Labor Force, 1990-2018 Isanti Co.**

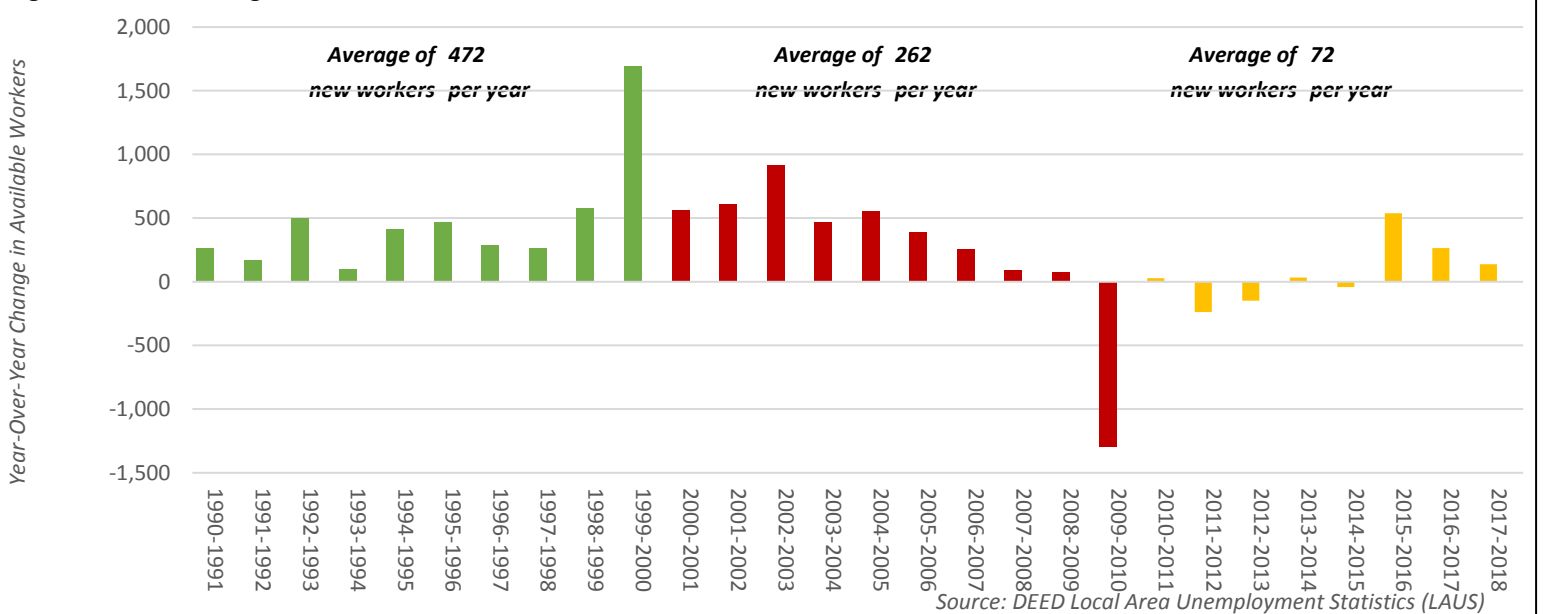
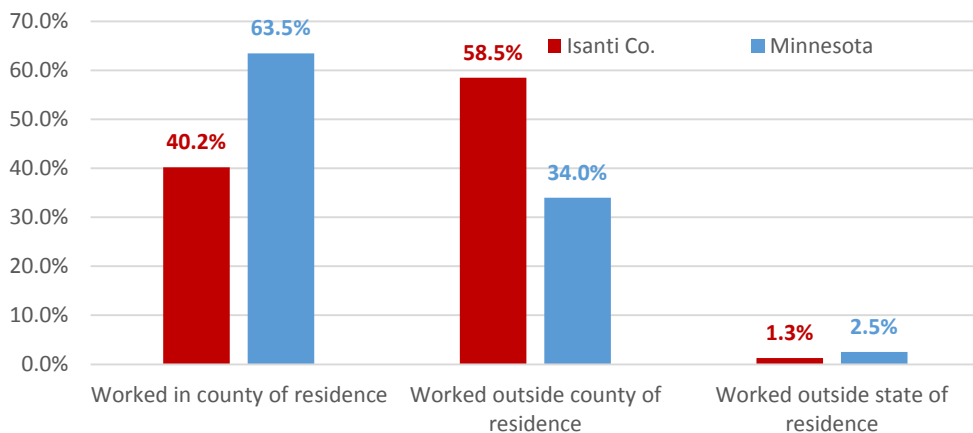

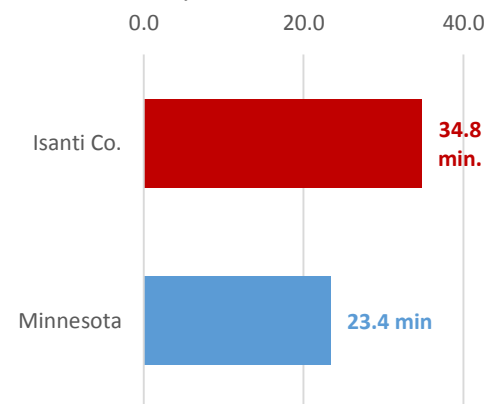

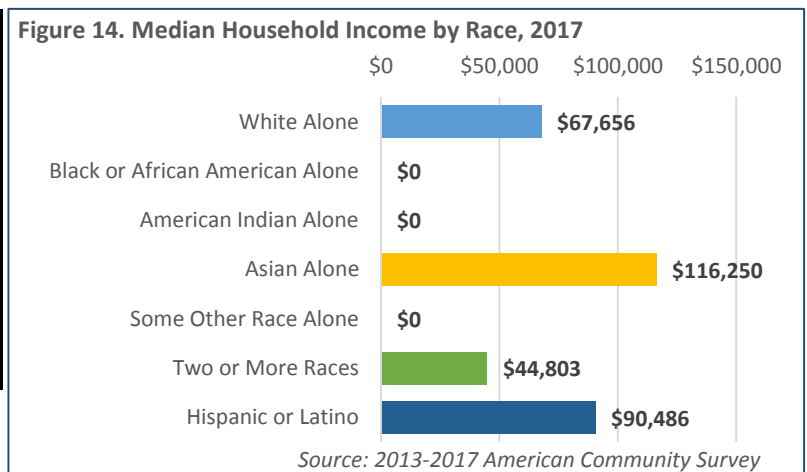

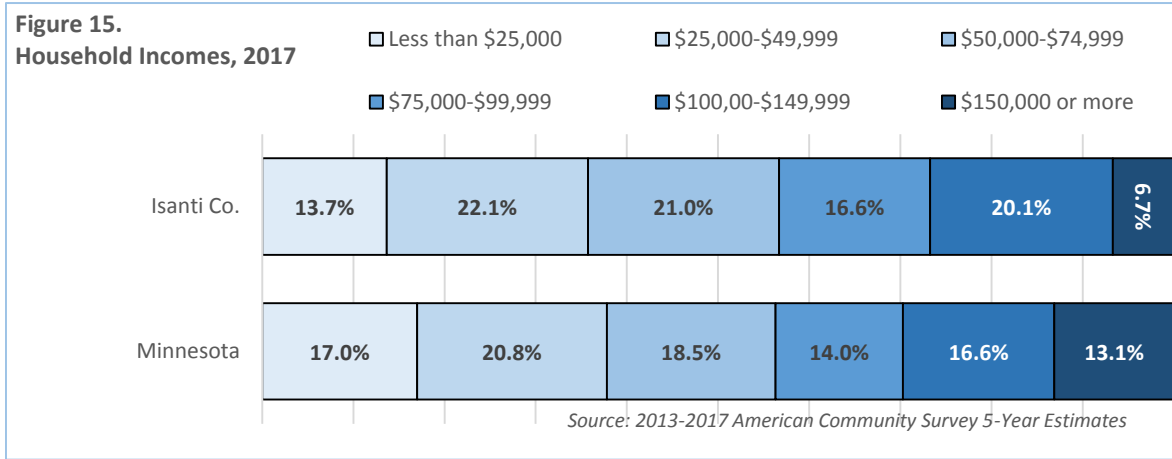

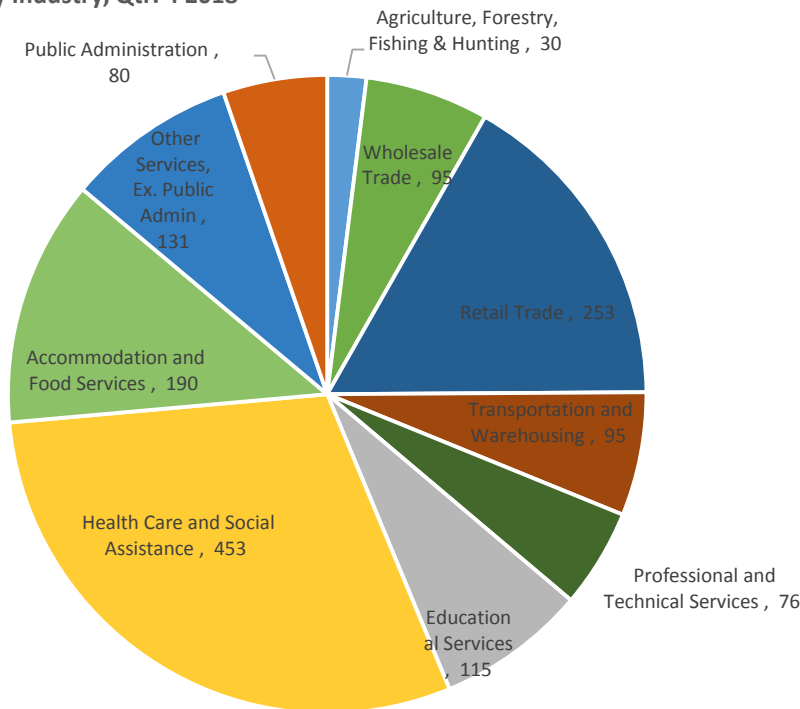

**Figure 16. Job Vacancies by Industry, Qtr. 4 2018**

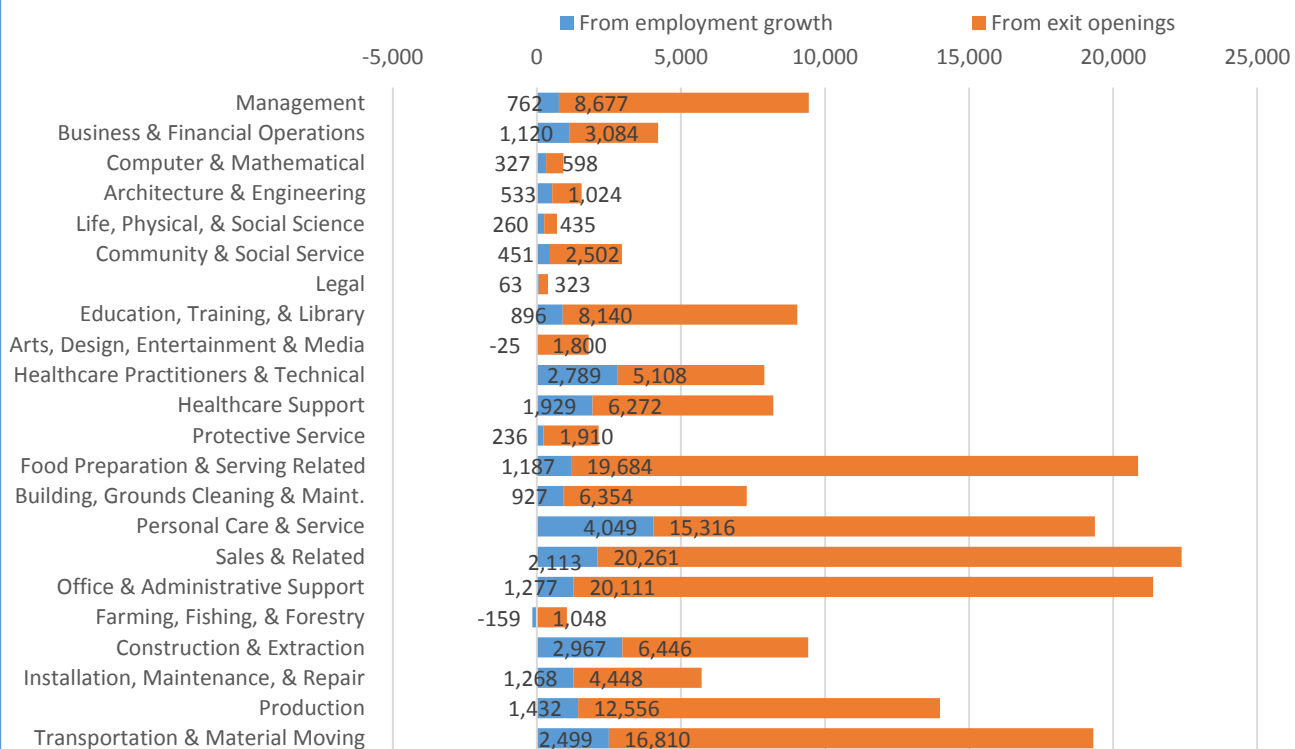

**Figure 18. Share of Jobs by Educational Requirements, 2019**

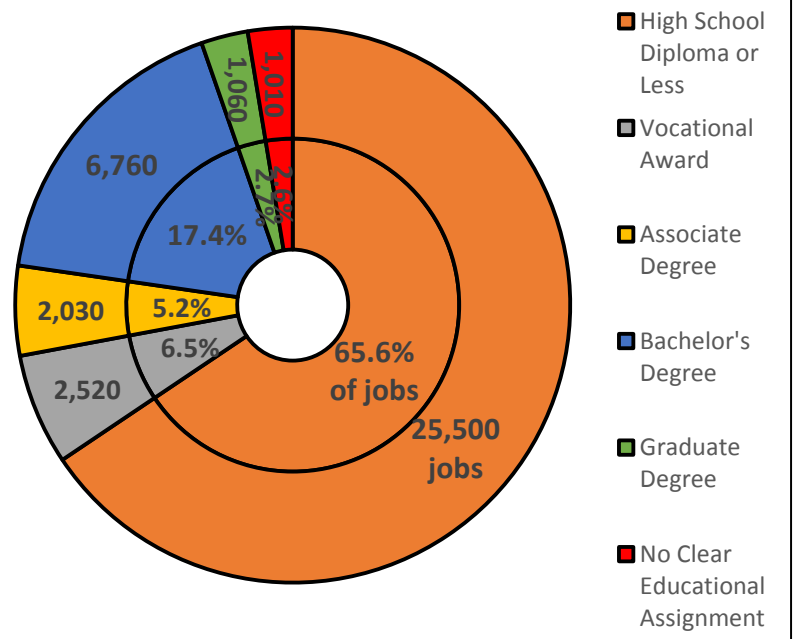




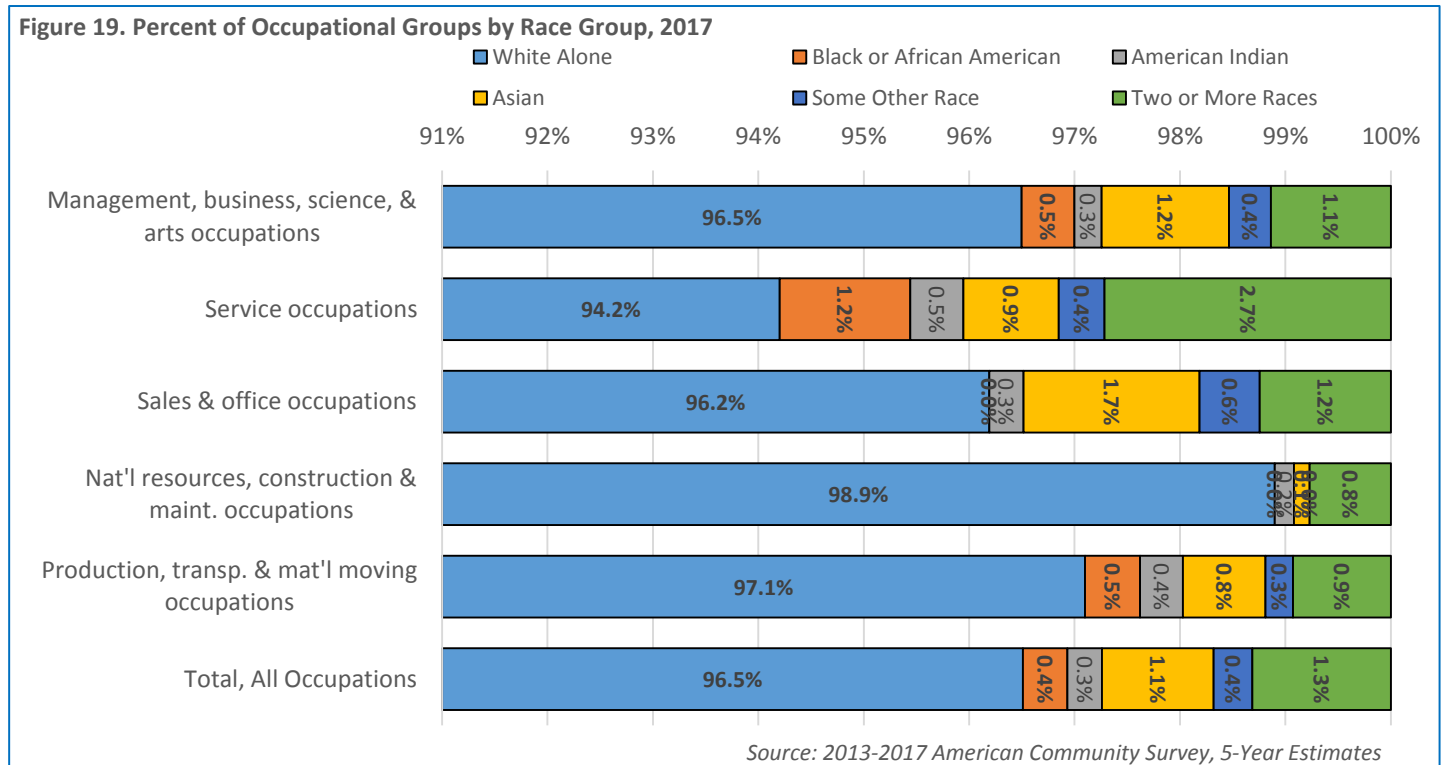

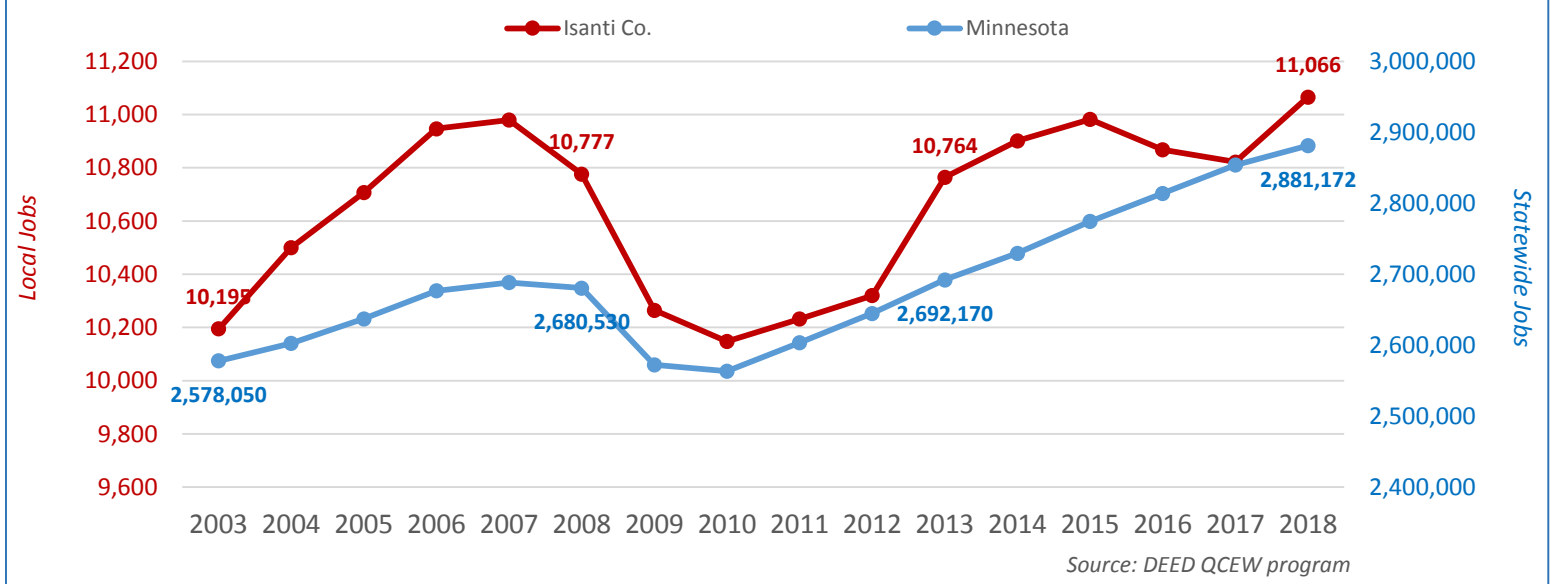

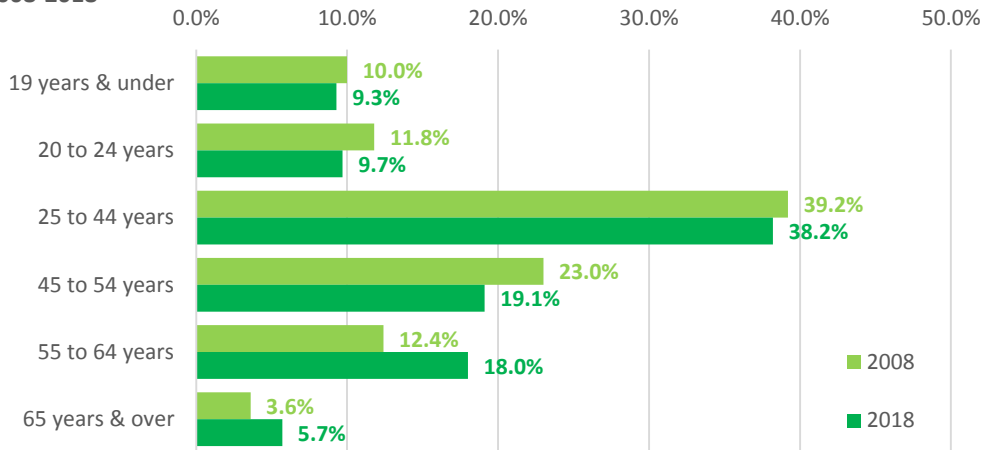

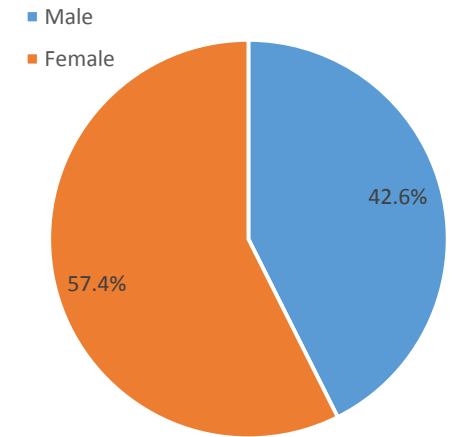

**Figure 21. Percentage of Workforce by Age Group, Total of All Industries, 2008-2018**

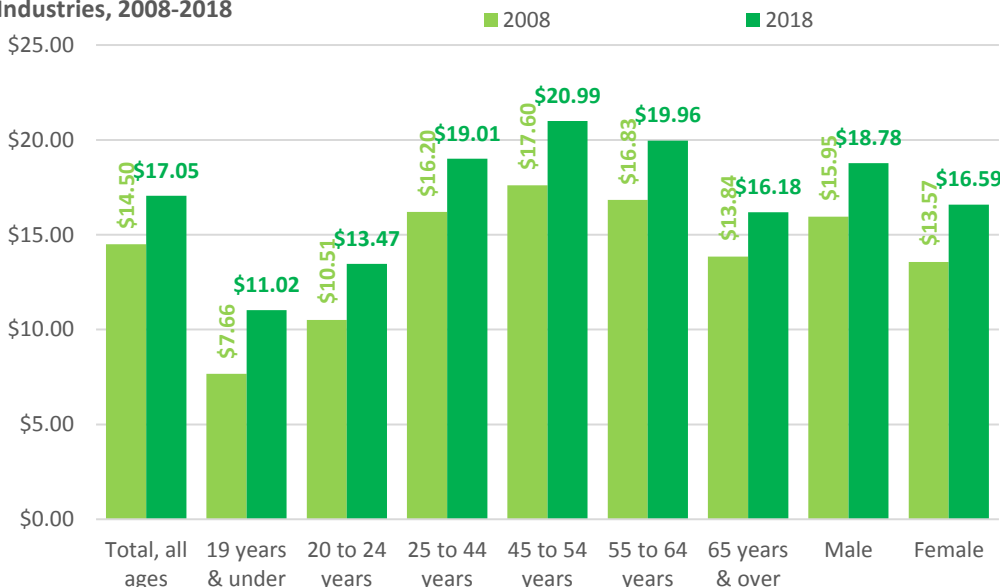

**Figure 22. Percentage of Workforce by Gender, Total of All Industries, 2018**

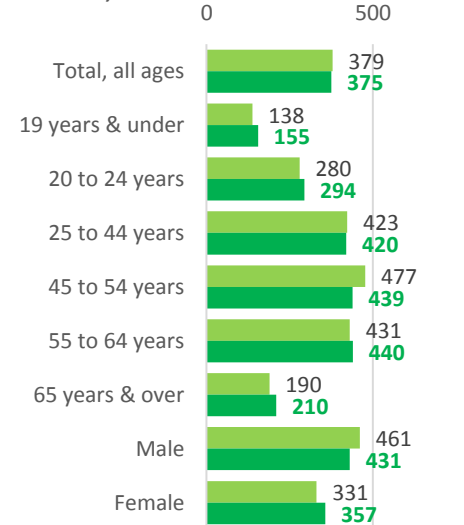


**Figure 23. Median Hourly Wage by Age Group and Gender, Total of All Industries, 2008-2018**

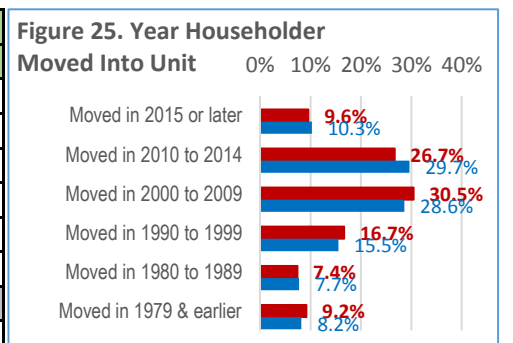

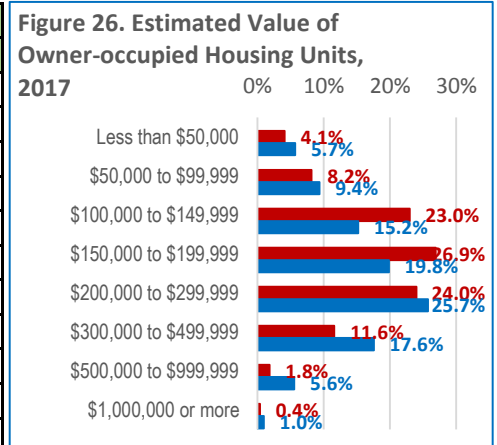


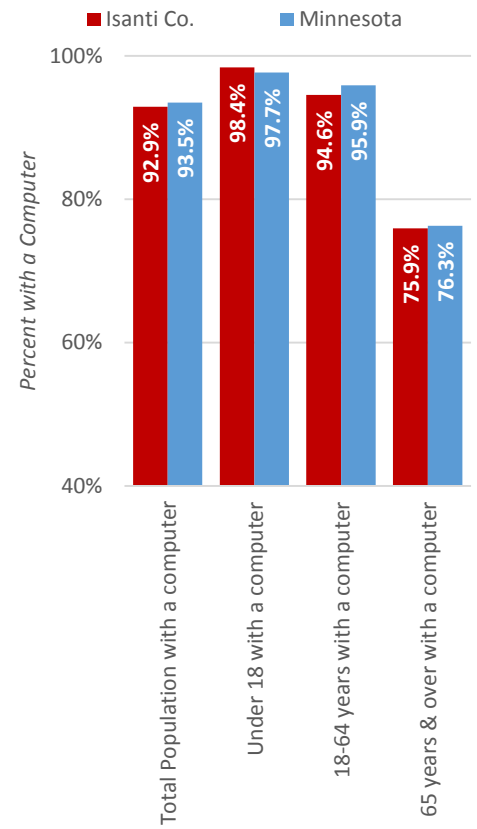
