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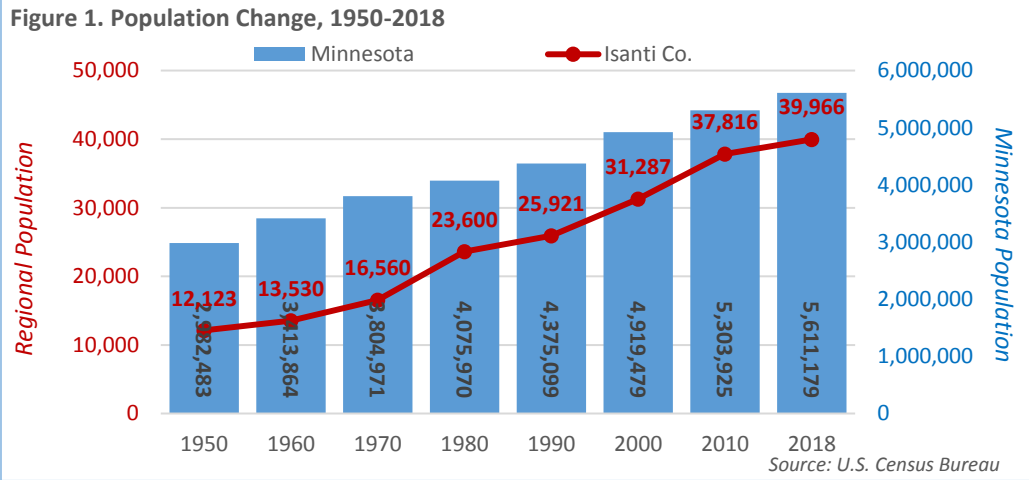

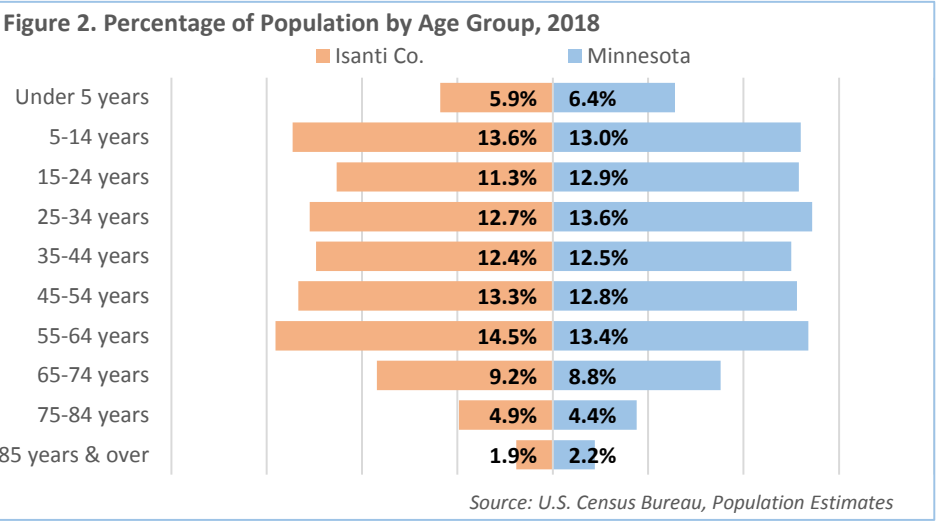

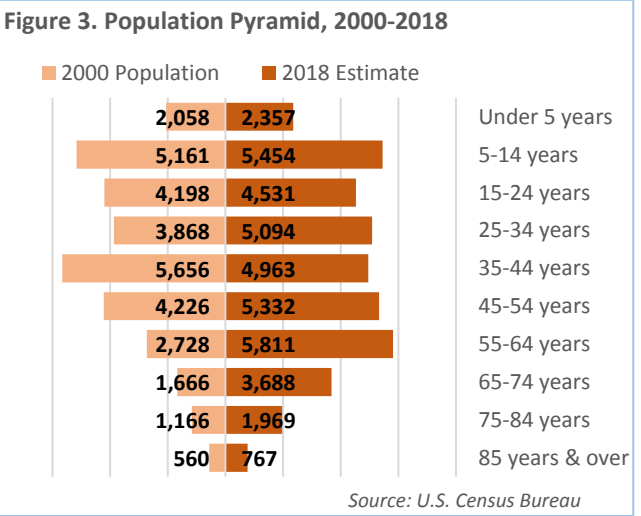

Figure 4. Population Projections by Age Group, 2020-2040

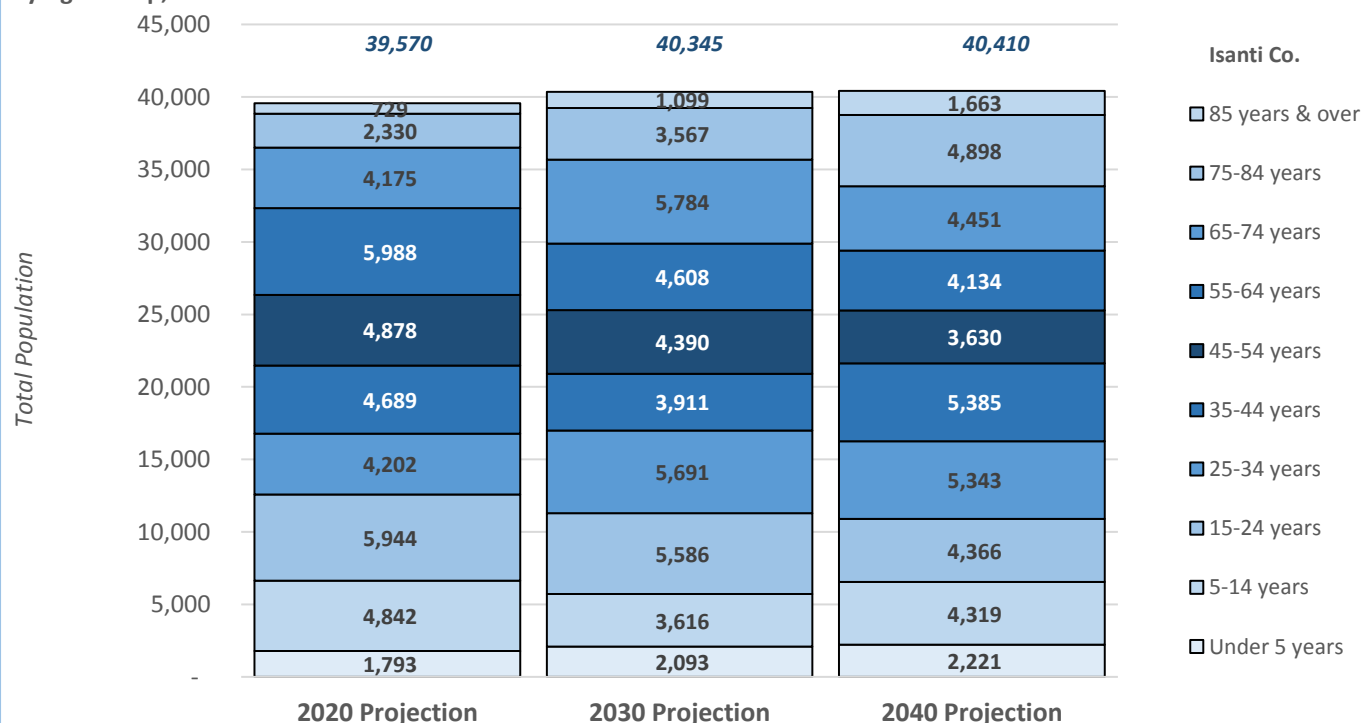

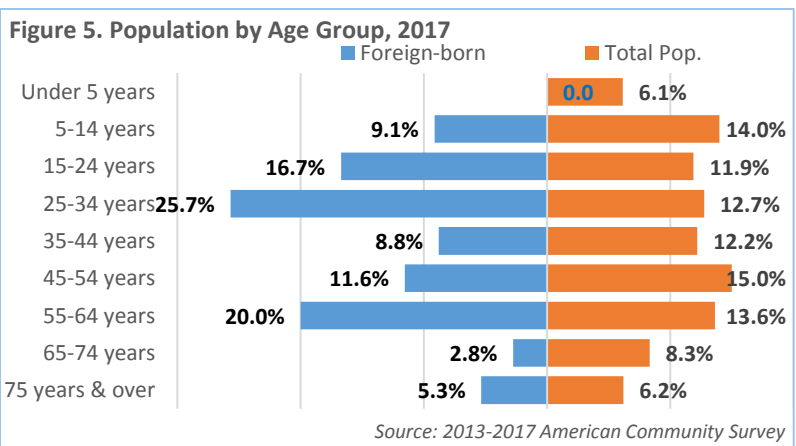

Figure 6. Annual Labor Force Estimates, 2000-2018

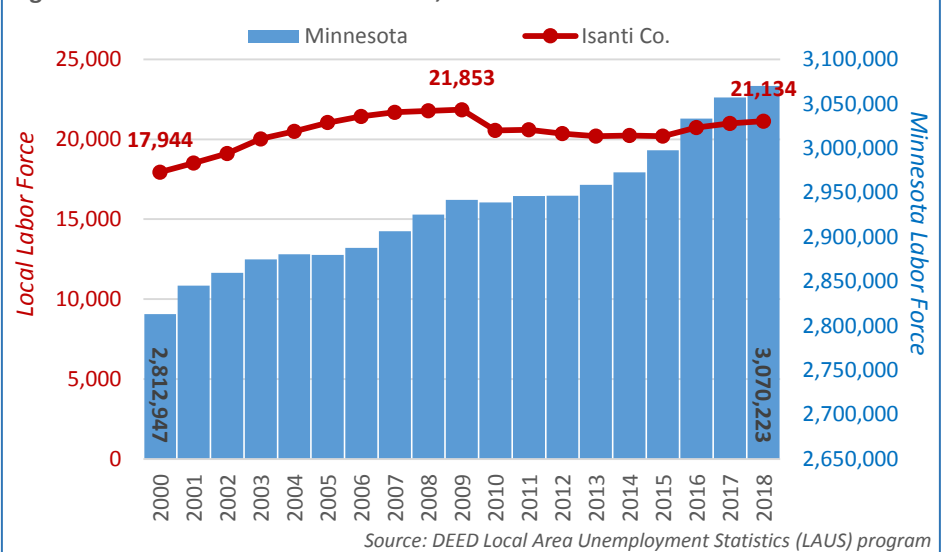


Figure 7. Unemployment Rates, 2000-2018

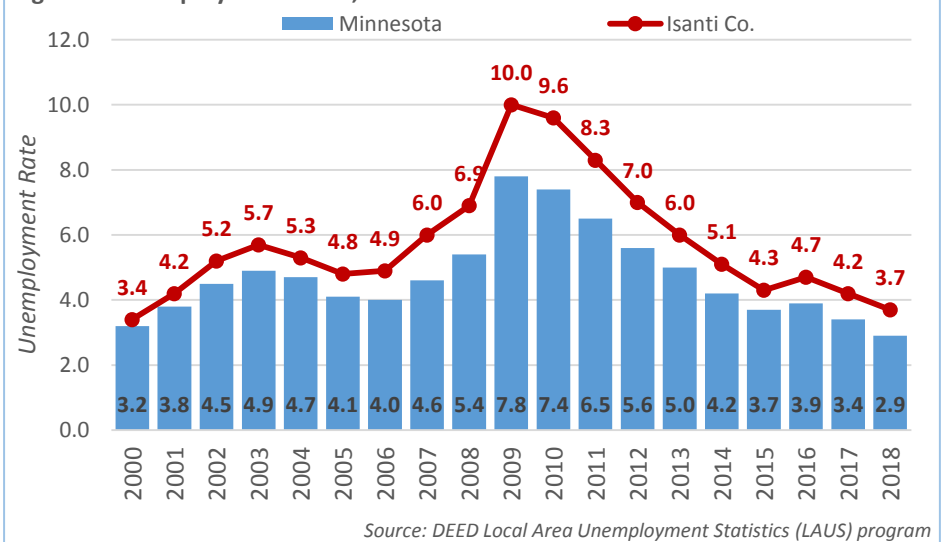


Figure 8. Jobseekers Per Vacancy, 2008-2018

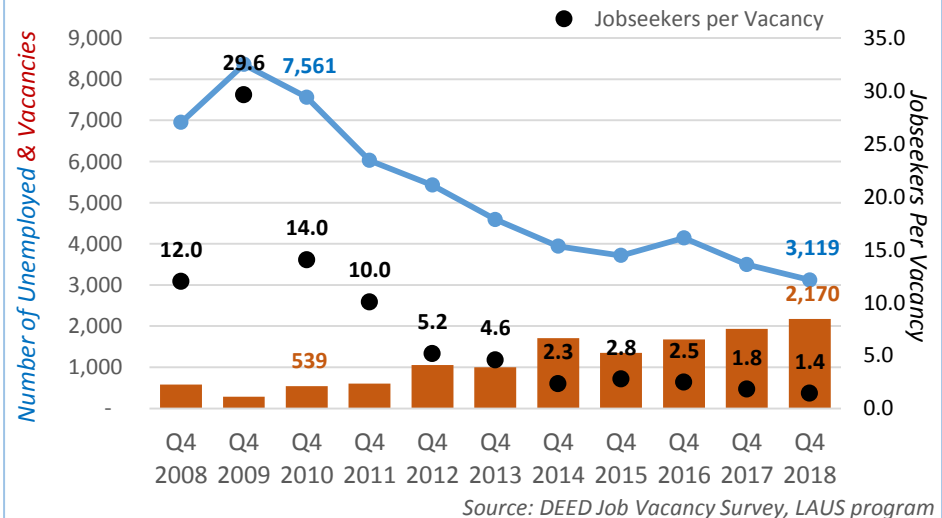

Figure 9. Annual Change in Labor Force, 1990-2018

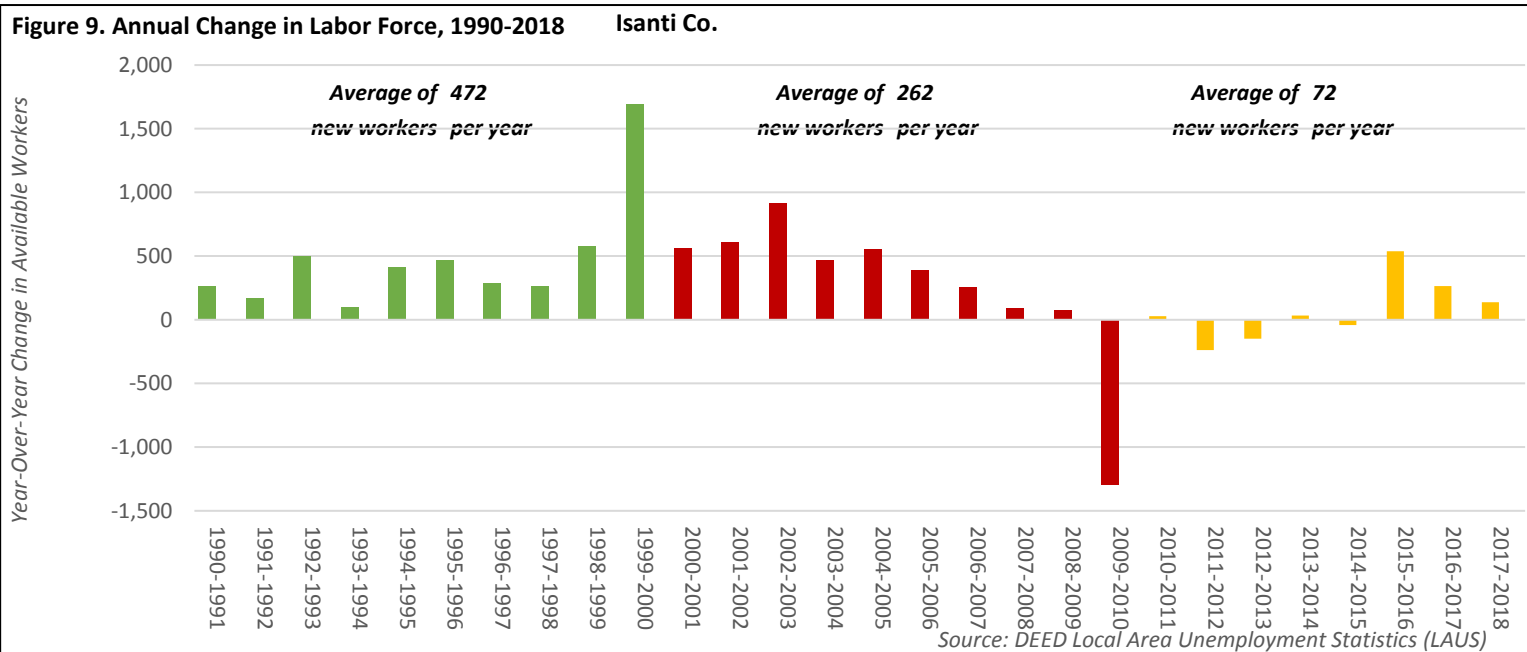
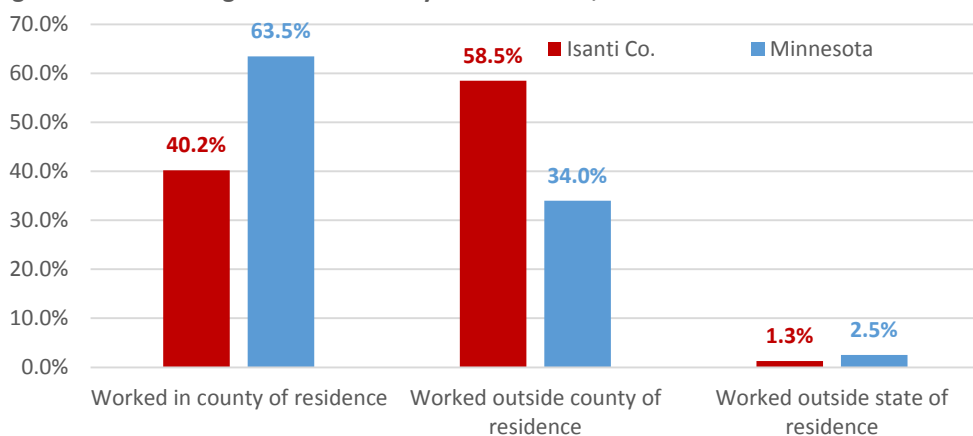

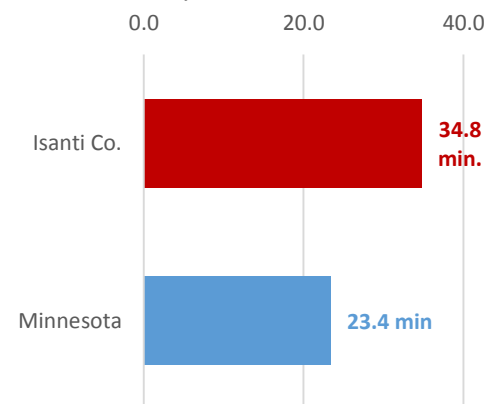

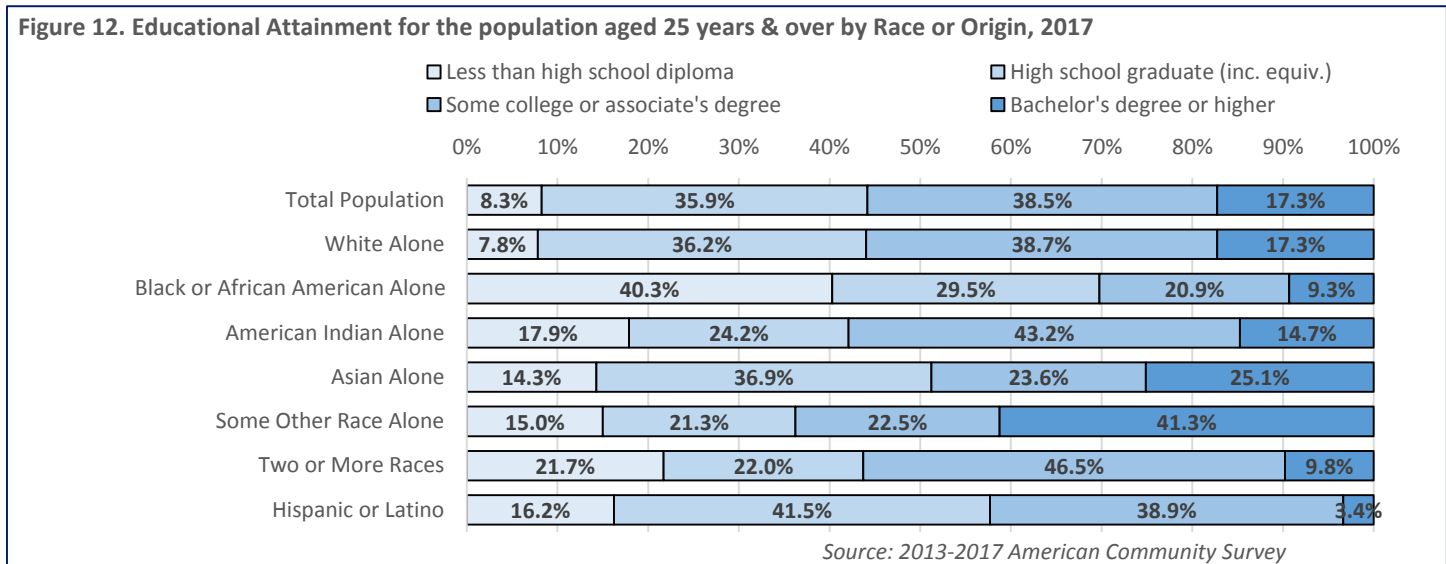

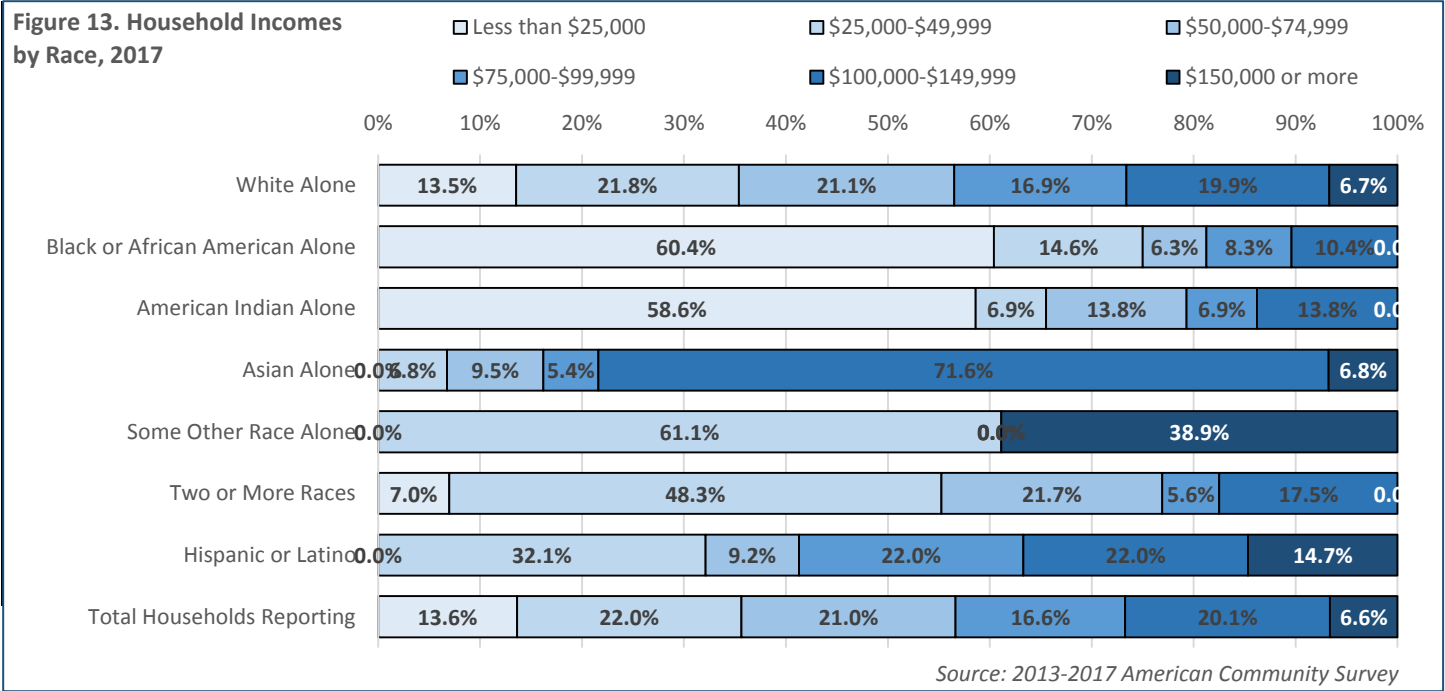

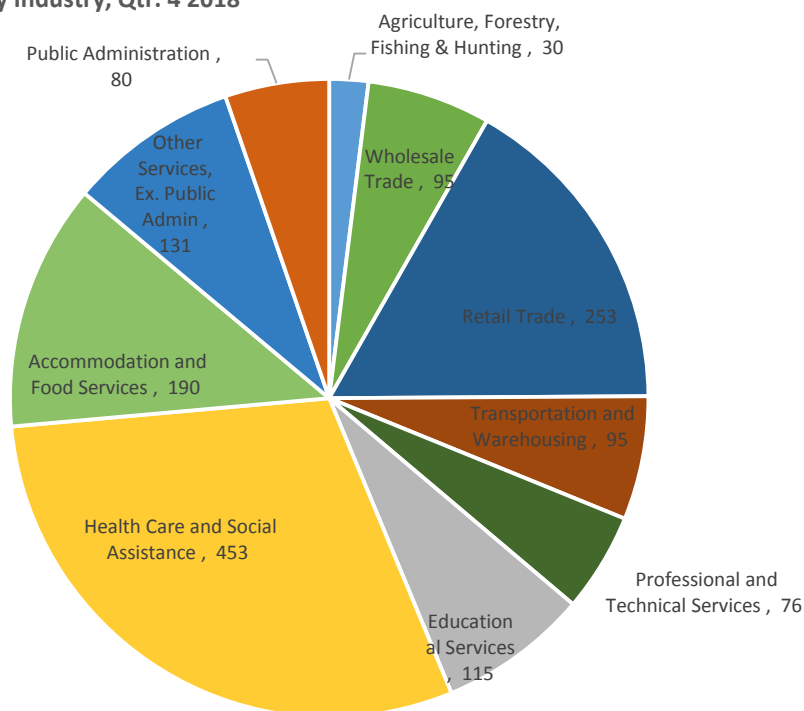
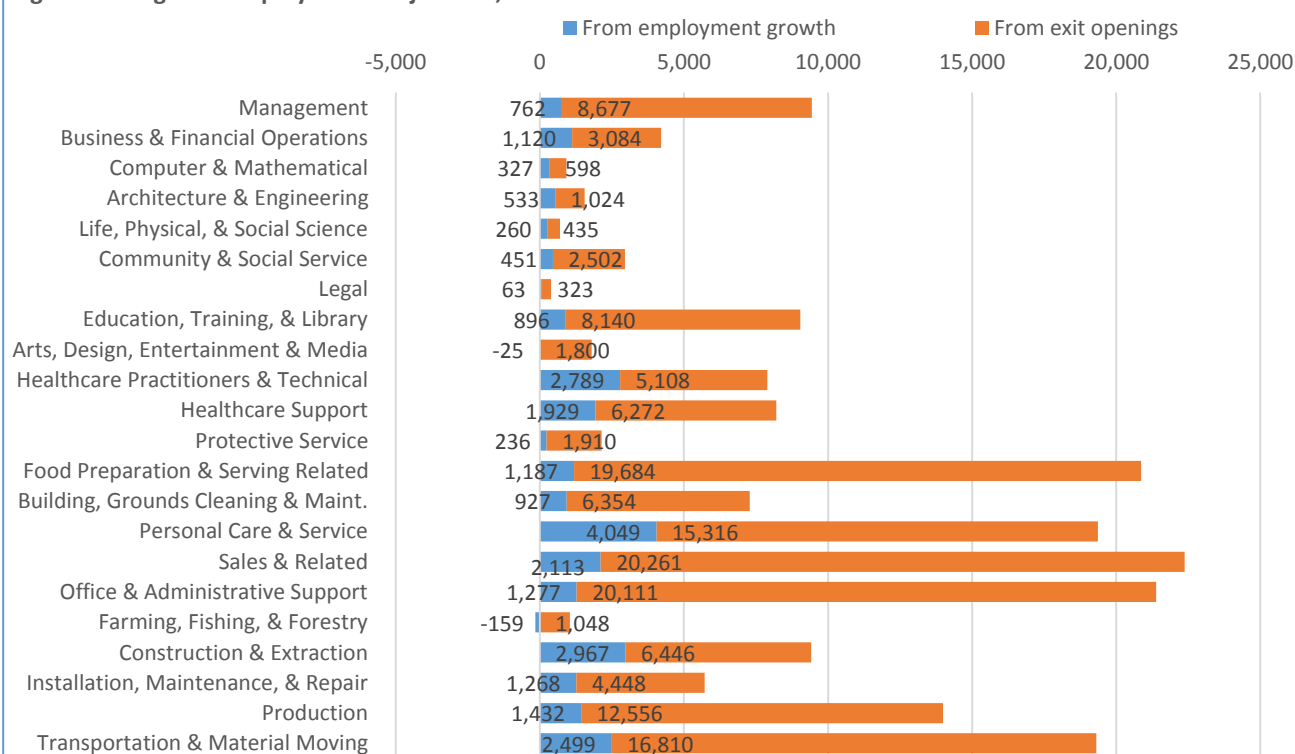
Figure 16. Job Vacancies by Industry, Qtr. 4 2018

Figure 18. Share of Jobs by Educational Requirements, 2019

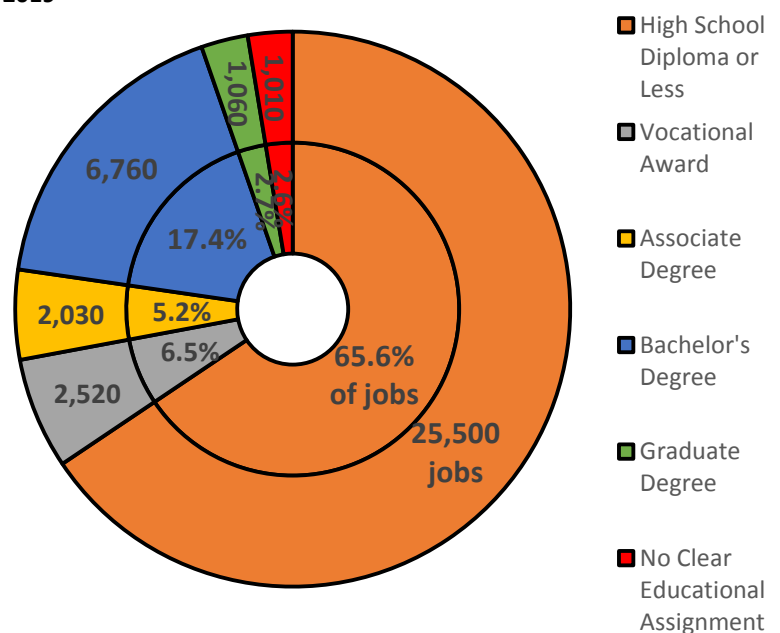

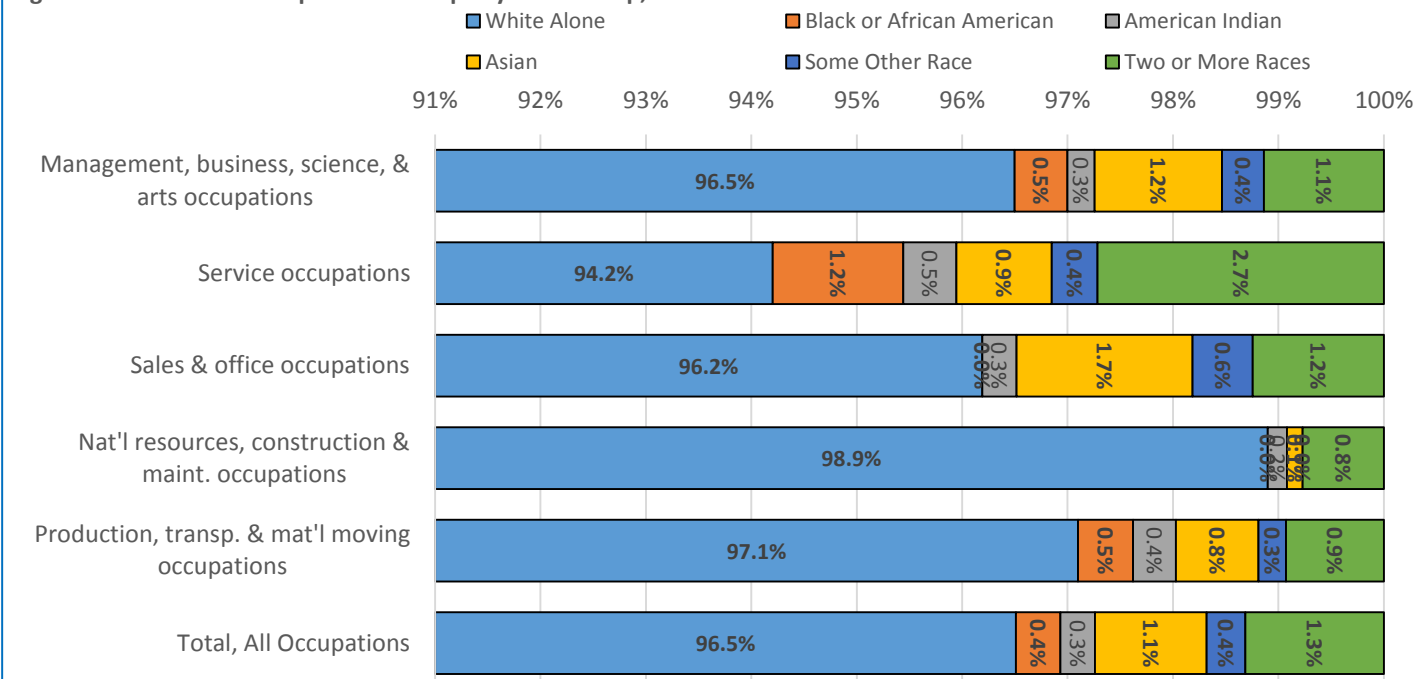

Figure 19. Percent of Occupational Groups by Race Group, 2017

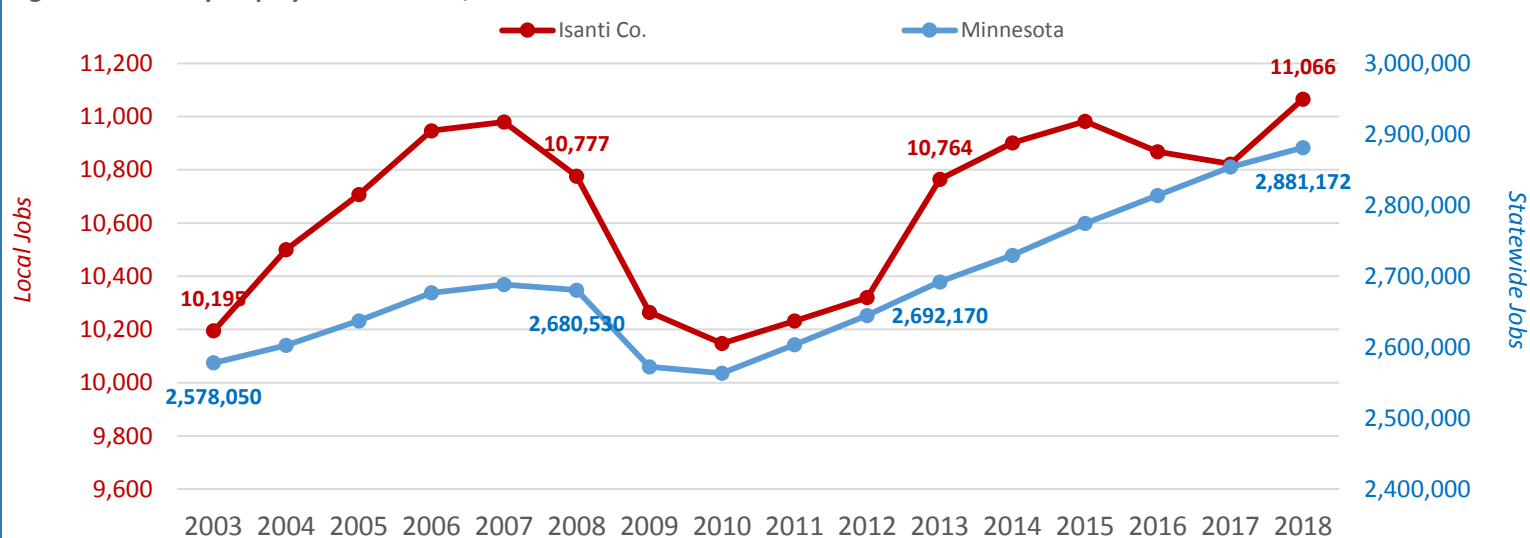

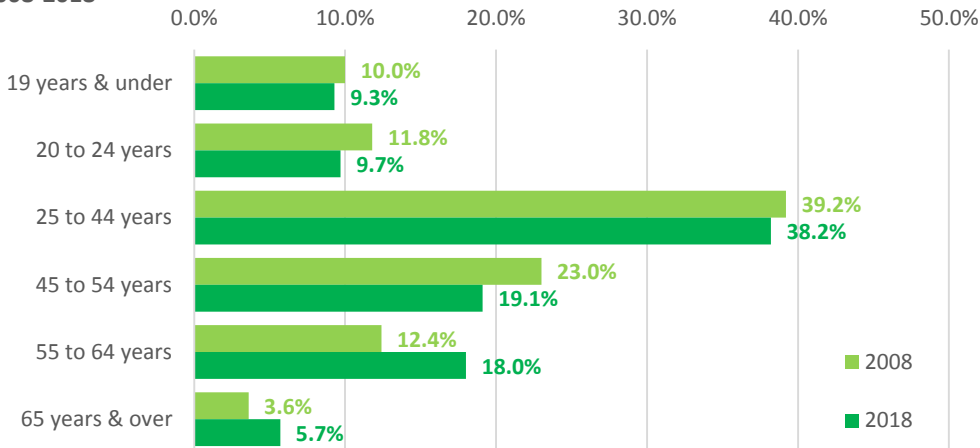

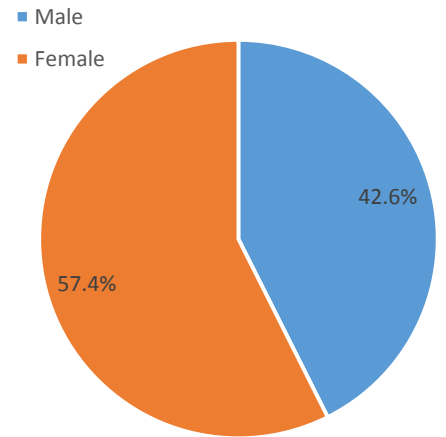
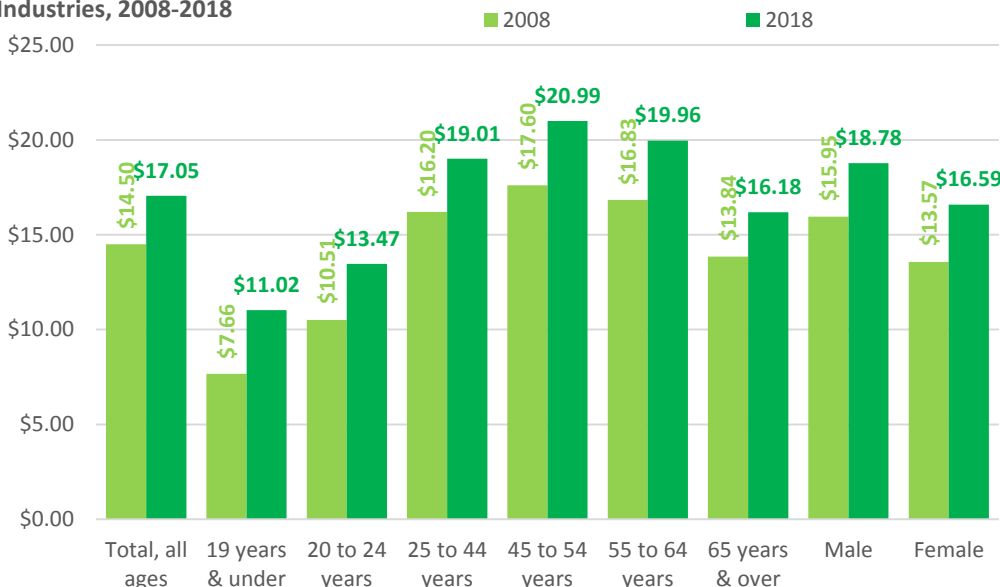

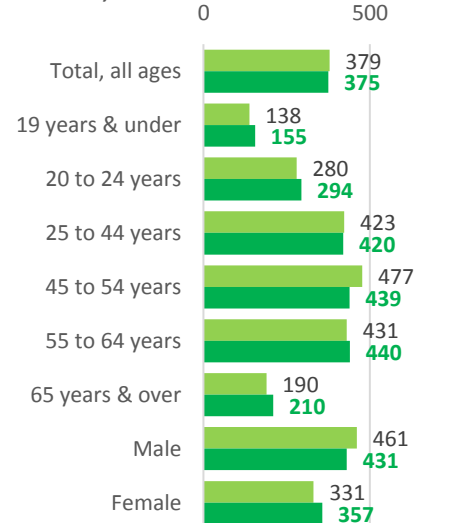

Figure 25. Year Householder Moved Into Unit

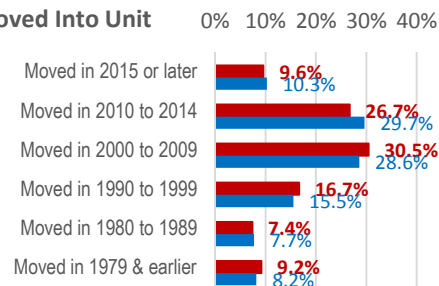

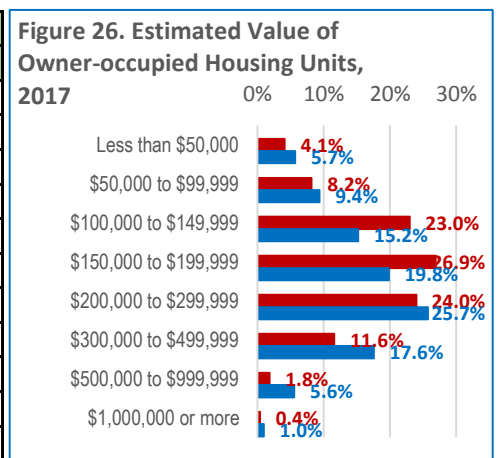


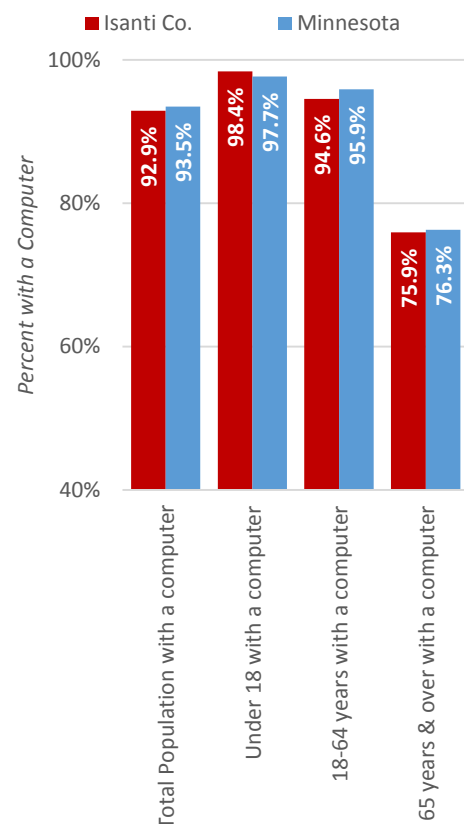
