Work Teams include RTCC members.

Definition of a volunteer driver has gotten very good hearings in the house and senate. Language in MN tax subtraction is also moving along, relatively well.

<u>Definition of a Volunteer Driver</u>: **HF586 (Murphy) /SF748 (Jasinski)** – Clearly **defines a volunteer driver** in law as not "for-hire."

State Income Tax Subtraction: **HF1716 (Koegel) /SF1766 (Howe)** – Creates a state income tax subtraction for

volunteer drivers to reduce their tax liability in Minnesota.

MCOTA working with DHS to keep dialogue open about vaccine locations and how transportation can be utilized.

Tim asked a question of Tom – Does MnDOT have a position a timing of a change in Covid related safety measures? Tom replied that they are taking their lead from the Federal Level/CDC input – no changes at this point.

Service Provider Updates:

Arrowhead – Pine, Chisago, Isanti counties: Brandon Nurmi - Arrowhead proceeding and things are going along well. No service changes for a while. Covid precautions are being addressed. New Volunteer Driver recruiter, Martin has retired. Scott Olson is new recruiter. Volunteers are being recruited. Scott will be also recruiting bus drivers.

Natalie – question: Is there a best way to send comments or questions to Arrowhead? Brandon: Julia or Brandon will answer questions and direct comments.

Declined rides/requests should be directed to a specific place. 30 day minimum public notice before any changes are made in routes. Accommodating route schedule – deviated route must be planned for.

Timber Trails – Kanabec county: Helen Pieper - More energy, more people wanting to get out. Kanabec County getting vaccinations out. Social distancing is difficult in a Class 400 bus. Volunteer drivers are not returning. Core number of faithful drivers who are doing multiple trips/day. Hopeful that once vaccinations are out, people will reconsider coming back to volunteer.

Tri-CAP – Mille Lacs county: Amy has left her position at Tri-CAP. No representation today.

Kanabec Cab: Shane Peterson – Not to be an Uber clone, 2 vehicles, 2 more recently purchased. Medical transport rides focus. Website/Marketplace/Facebook. \$5 rides around town. Working to purchase 2 more vehicles per month.

Karen will put together a list of contacts and links to provide after the meeting.

Jefferson Lines: Nick Zelle as new Advisory Board member. Lowered capacity - working to get ridership back. Honing in on Community Colleges in the area to cut back on car use. Looking to coordinate for first / last mile in intercity travel. Not expanding routes in foreseeable future. Karen will put Nick in touch with Joe Mulford, President of Pine Technical and Community College.

Staff Updates:

- TMCC (Transportation Management Coordination Collaborative): Networking, keeping directory current. Survey at a standstill with Tri-CAP situation, GIS mapping.
- Policy Action: Moving into Volunteer Driver subcommittee/task Volunteer Driver Coalition, MCOTA, 5310/5311 funding available, smaller vehicles possibly become available, ride sharing with PHASE as partnerships.
- Transportation Exploration: Alternative modes, stay abreast in updates. First/Last mile automated vehicles would be advantage.
- Volunteer Driver Program Development, Coordination & Training: TRY folding, work with new Arrowhead recruiter, volunteer brochure through MCOTA in the works. Volunteer Driver Forum Series encouraged. Karen will send the link to the Forum.

Phase 4 – Logic Model – use of this in building Work Plan for 2021 – 2023 Grant Application:

Karen will send out the completed logic model. We would like the Advisory Board members (YOU) to be loud voices and your ideas to be key components in a variety of the upcoming tasks.

Michelle gave us details of our upcoming reasoning and content: MCOTA Operations Committee were charged with looking at the work of the RTCCs and how outcomes can be measured. What tool/process can be utilized to see what work is being done? Logic Models were introduced. Actions -> Outcomes. Point is for all RTCCs to arrive at similar points after 2 years in order to build a TMCC that could be a statewide entity. She provided us the big picture of what (and why) we are developing.
