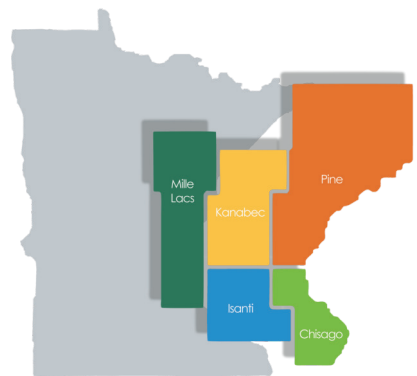

WORKING TO STRENGTHEN REGIONAL TRANSPORTATION

The East Central Regional Transportation Coordinating Council (ECRTCC) is working to improve mobility and access to transportation across the rural areas of east central Minnesota. Efforts aim to ensure that all residents—regardless of age, ability, or location—have reliable options for reaching essential destinations.

Work focuses on using existing resources efficiently, reducing duplication, and developing a coordinated transportation system that meets the diverse needs of the region. Through collaboration with public transit providers, human service agencies, health care organizations, and private-sector partners, ECRTCC works to identify service gaps and remove barriers that limit mobility.



Efforts are also directed toward expanding transit services in under connected communities, improving coordination among providers, and increasing public awareness of available transportation options.

These collective initiatives reflect a strong commitment to creating a more connected and equitable transportation network—one that supports access to jobs, education, health care, and community services while contributing to the overall economic vitality of east central Minnesota.

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TYPES OF SERVICE IN THE REGION

Public Providers

Organizations that operate transit services that move people efficiently within and between communities. Their main purpose is to provide accessible, affordable, and reliable mobility for the general public, especially for people who may not have access to a private vehicle.

In rural Minnesota, public transit providers are essential for connecting residents to jobs, healthcare, education, and community resources where transit is limited or unavailable.

Types of Services Provided

- **Scheduled Services:** Common stops that public transit buses make each hour or each day of the week.
- **Dial-a-Ride or On-Demand:** Curb-to-Curb public transportation within designed parameters.
- **Commuter Routes:** Standard distance bus route between communities that public transit serves. These routes deviate up to ½ mile off its intended route per rider request.

TYPES OF SERVICE IN THE REGION

Private Providers

In rural Minnesota, private transportation refers to travel that is individually owned, operated, or contracted, rather than provided by public or nonprofit transit agencies. Because distances are long and population density is low, private transportation plays an important role in how people get around day-to-day.

Electric Car Charging

Car charging stations—also called electric vehicle (EV) chargers—are places where drivers can plug in and recharge electric cars instead of filling up with gasoline. They supply electricity from the local power grid to the vehicle's battery. East Central Minnesota has many for local residents as well as travelers. See page 12 for a list.

Park & Ride

A Park and Ride is a designated parking area where people can leave their personal vehicles and transfer to shared transportation, such as a bus, vanpool, or carpool. It's free to leave your vehicle and designed to make commuting more convenient, reduce traffic, and lower travel costs.

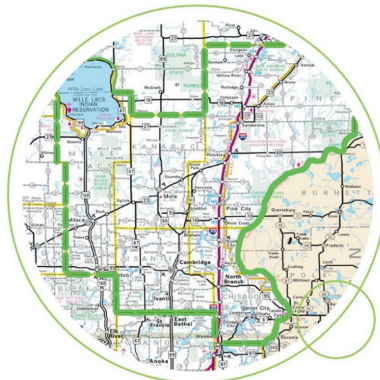

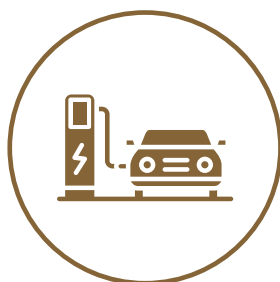

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WHERE CAN YOU LOOK FOR ADDITIONAL HELP?

Other programs that offer help with transportation will depend on where you live:

- Reduced Fare Programs.

Low-cost bus passes are **sometimes available** for older adults, people with disabilities, and people with Medicaid. Ask your doctor or local public transit agency about these programs.

- Non-Emergency Medical Transportation.

For Medicaid participants and some private insurance plans, free rides **may be offered** to and from doctor visits through non-emergency medical transportation. Call or go online to your state Medicaid agency or private insurance plan to learn more.

- Volunteer Driver Programs.

Volunteer driver programs are available in areas of East Central Minnesota. To inquire about availability in your area, contact your local public transit provider.

- Veterans Transportation Program.

Rides are available for veterans going to doctor visits. Contact your county's veteran services or va.gov/healthbenefits/vtp

- Carpooling.

A search online may offer a carpooling program in your area.

- Virtual Care.

If all else fails and it's hard to get to doctor visits, ask your doctor about virtual care. Often you can visit with a nurse or doctor via computer or phone.
